NOTES TO THE CONDUCTOR

Holiday Short Cuts for Beginning Band – Vol. 1 is a set of four individual arrangements of classic holiday songs, each of which introduce or reinforce specific musical objectives. In addition, this collection is designed to serve as a complete or partial repertoire for your beginning or developing band's winter holiday concert.

I. Sleigh Ride

Sleigh Ride, one of the most popular holiday songs, was written in 1948 by American composer Leroy Anderson. This arrangement is set in a moderately fast $\frac{4}{4}$ time. As your band progresses, you may wish to gradually increase the tempo, and even eventually conduct the music in "2."

This arrangement is designed to **introduce or reinforce key changes**, as the music goes from concert B to E then returning to B to It also **reinforces changing dynamics** with crescendos from mp to f.

The upper line of the percussion 1 part should be played by one person. This will develop the concept of changing percussion instruments—in this case, from snare drum to suspended cymbal and back.

II. Rockin' Around the Christmas Tree

This song has been a holiday favorite since 1958, when it was first recorded by 13-year-old Brenda Lee.

Before rehearsing this piece for the first time review the correct fingerings/slide position for **concert**. The arrangement also includes various articulations staccato and accent. All quarter notes not marked with an articulation should be played full-value.

Also introduced or reinforced is the concept of two-hand coordination in the percussion section

The snare drum and suspended cymbal parts are to be played by one person, as well as the cowbell and tom-tom part. Rotate the parts to allow each of your percussionists to experience playing on two instruments at the same time.

III. Let it Snow! Let it Snow! Let it Snow!

Written by Sammy Cahn and Jule Styne in 1945, this popular holiday song has been covered by tozens of performers.

This arrangement **introduces** reinforces the concepts of divisi and unison in the upper winds, as well as double stops in the bells. Other keyboard percussion instruments may also be used. To play double stops accurately, make sure that both mallets strike the bars at the same time.

Also reinforced is the concept of hand-root coordination in the percussion section. The percussion 2 line contains a part for suspended cymbal and hi-hat pedal, which is to be played by one person.

V. Santa Claus Is Comin' to Town

This arrangement of the timeless holiday classic reinforces the concept of D.S. al Coda. It also offers solo opportunities for clarinet, alto sax, tenor sax, or horn.

The snare rolls in measures 24 and 25 may be performed as either multiple-bounce rolls or 17-stroke rolls.

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
